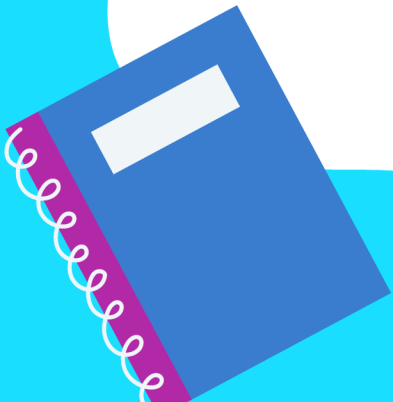

Purpose of the R Syllable Slides

So...your hard-working child has mastered the R sound in isolation and they are ready to move onto syllables-YAY! Here is a way to show them how to slide the “ruh” into vowels for initial /r/ or “er” at the beginning, middle, and end of vowels for vocalic /r/ to create the foundation of words, the syllables.

This is just the thing to help your student slide into habit-forming success!





Suggested Use

Use the page that your student has most success with first. If you are not sure, try them all to see what works best! If in teletherapy, use your cursor to model the “slides.”

If in person, model sliding your finger down or across the slide when producing the sounds. You could also use a mini toy, sticker, or a Flat Stanley to slide!

Once your student can say all of the syllables with 100% accuracy, 3 sessions in a row, then, they are ready to start working on those types of words.

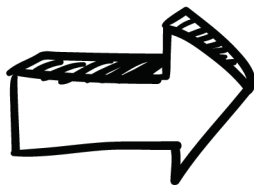

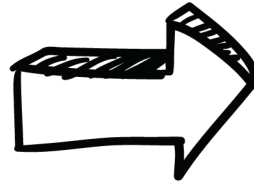
